

## COURSES OFFERED

## B.A LL.B. (Hons.)

Five Year Integrated Double Degree B.A LL.B. (Hons) which consists of regular study for a minimum period of 10 semesters in five academic years, after plus two. The courses are specifically designed keeping in mind the latest development in the field of law and Justice.

## B.B.A LL.B. (Hons.)

B.B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) is a five year integrated law program. Over the ten semesters, besides mandatory law papers, students get an opportunity to learn modules such as Principles of Management, Financial Management, Organizational Behaviour, Business Economics and the like. In addition to the BBA and law modules that the course contains, BSOLS intends to take care of the overall development of the student so as to enable them to explore the vistas of opportunities that lie ahead.

## B.Com. LL.B. (Hons.)

Five year integrated program of B.Com LL.B (Hons.) is called integrated because its course curriculum involves the study of commerce along with an in depth study of law and corporate world.

## Unitary LL.B. (3 Year)

Unitary Degree Course (3 year) shall be three years comprising of 6 semesters, A semester shall consist of not less than 90 working days. The period of a semester shall ordinarily be inclusive of the time required for conduct of examinations of the relevant semesters.

## LL.M. (2 Year)

BSOLS offers LL.M. Degree Course under three specialisations i.e., Maritime law (maximum intake: 15 students), Commercial Law (maximum intake: 15 students) and Criminal Law (maximum intake 15 students). The 2 Year LL.M Degree course which leads to a Masters Degree in law involves a regular course of study for a minimum period of two academic years (four semesters).

### **ADMISSION CRITERIA**

**Eligibility**: Minimum percentage of marks not below 45% (without rounding off) of the total marks in case of General Category applicants and 42% of total marks (without rounding off) in case of applicants, to be obtained for the qualifying plus two examination.

**Selection process: Intake:** 60:50% of the seats will be based on the Entrance Examination conducted by the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations, Government of Kerala. These students will be allotted and admitted to the college after the centralized counseling to be conducted by the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations of the Government of Kerala.

50% of the seats will be filled by the Management and the application procedure is as follows.

**Management Admission Procedure:** The application forms for admission to the management quota can be collected from the office. There will be an entrance exam conducted by the law school. The selected students have to go for group discussion. The shortlisted candidates will be admitted to the college.

**Merit seat admission**: The 50% seats for each course are reserved for Government Quota. The students, who seek merit admission, have to apply for the Kerala Law Entrance Examinations and the seats are allotted by Commissioner of Entrance Examination according to their rank and preferences.

## SEMESTER PATTERN

The course leading to integrated double degree shall be conducted in semester system including tutorials, moot courts exercise, seminars and other practical exercises. Provided there shall be at least 30 lecture hours per week.

## **HOURS OF INSTRUCTION**

Class timings for all programme will be from 9.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. All students are directed to be present in the classroom 5 minutes before the scheduled class time

## **EXAMINATION**

- There shall be a University examination at the end of each semester. To be eligible for admission to the examination of a particular semester a candidate shall secure not less than 75% attendance during the semester and his/her conduct should be satisfactory.
- For each written paper carrying 100 marks, 25 % shall be set apart for being awarded by the way of internal assessment and 75% marks for the written external examination. Internal assessment shall be made on the basis of overall performance during the semester such as regularity of attendance, preparation and presentation of assignments, test paper scoring and class room participation. Details of awarding marks for internal assessment are given in the rule book for students. A candidate who has failed in a paper shall be eligible to write the papers in the subsequent regular examinations.

## **ATTENDANCE**

- Separate attendance shall be maintained for each subject by the teachers concerned.
- Students representing the College/University in academic and extra curricular activities shall obtain prior permission in wrinting from the Principal.
- No student shall be allowed to appear the University examinations at the end of each semester in a subject if the student concerned has not attended minimum of 75% of the classes held in the subject concerned as also in the moot court exercises, tutorials and practical training conducted in the subject taken together.
- Separate 75% attendance is also required in each of the compulsory clinical courses. Provided that if a student

for any exceptional reasons fails to attain 75% of the classes held in any subject, the University may condone the shortage of attendance as per existing rules.

## Marks for attendance shall be granted as follows:

Below 75% attendance (boys) Nil Below 73% attendance as per MGU regulation (girls) Nil 75% to 79% 1 mark 80% to 84% 2 marks 85% to 89% 3 marks 90% to 94 % 4 marks 95% and above 5 marks

## Pass Minimum and classification

- A candidate who secures not less than 40% marks in the external examination separately and 50% in the aggregate of the total marks for that paper shall be declared to have passed the examination in that paper.
- Ranking shall be done on the basis of the marks obtained by the candidate in the whole examination provided he/she secures a pass in all subjects in the first chance.

## Pattern of Question Paper and distribution of marks for all subjects except languages.

- Out of 100 marks for each paper: 25 marks shall be set apart for the internal assessment.
- The remaining 75 marks for University examination shall be distributed as follows:
- Part A- Short answers: 15 marks (3 marks x 5 questions=15)
- Part B- short essays/problems: 30 marks (10 marks x-3 questions=30)
- Part C- Essays: 30 marks (15 marks x 2 questions=30)

The internal assessment marks shall be distributed as follows:

a) Attendance : 5 marks
b) Class room assignments : 10 marks
c) Test paper : 10 marks
Total : 25 marks

## **MANDATORY INTERNSHIPS**

As per the Rules of Legal Education laid down by the Bar Council of India in 2008, each five year course student has to undergo an internship for not less than 20 weeks to carry out legal studies under Non-governmental Organizations, Trial Advocates, Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory Authorities, Legislature and Parliament, Other Legal Functionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies, Local Self-Government and in other Legal Institutions where such training can be imparted to such students. Students cannot undergo internship in any year continuously for more than 4 weeks. All students are expected to undergo training under Trial and Appellate Advocates not more than twice. A student who has to complete more than 4 weeks of internship shall not be promoted to the tenth semester.

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## NATURE & DURATION

The LLM course which leads to a Master Degree in Law shall consist of a regular course of study for a minimum period of two academic years (four semesters). The study shall by regular attendance. Lectures, discussions, seminars, home assignments, test papers and preparation of dissertation and integral components of the course. The first semester will consist of 3 compulsory papers, teaching practice and one project work. The second semester will consist of 4 papers of the concerned optional. The third semester will consist of 3 papers of the concerned optional and the fourth semester will consist of one paper of the concerned optional, dissertation and viva-voce.

## **ADMISSION CRITERIA**

## Eligibility

Candidates who have passed LLB examination (5 year / 3-year course) with a minimum of 50% marks from the universities in Kerala or other universities recognised by the universities in Kerala as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission to the L.L.M. course. No rounding off of percentage of marks to the nearest higher integer is permitted.

Candidates appearing / appeared for the regular final year L.L.B. examination can also apply for the entrance examination. Such candidates become eligible for admission only if they produce the Provisional / Degree Certificate of the qualifying examination and the mark lists of all parts of the qualifying examination at the time of Centralised Allotment Process.

There is no upper age limit for admission to the L.L.M. Course.

## **SELECTION PROCESS**

## **Merit Seat Admission**

Admission to 50% of the total seats will be based on the entrance examination conducted by the Commission of Entrance Examination (CEE), Government of Kerala. The Students who seek admission to merit seats have to apply for the entrance examination conducted by the CEE. These students will be allotted and admitted to the college after the centralised counselling conducted by CEE.

- Commercial Law (total intake: 15)
- Criminal Law (total intake: 15)
- Maritime Law (total intake: 15)

## **MANAGEMENT ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

Candidates applying for admission in the management quota will be ranked based on the percentage of marks secured for their 5 years/3 years L.L.B. degree examination and an interview. Admission will be based on the rank list prepared as above.

## **HOURS OF INSTRUCTION**

The class timing will be 9.30 a.m. to 3.30 p.m.

## **ASSESSMENT**

As part of Practical Examination -1 (Teaching Practice) each student has to deliver a lecture on a topic assigned, before the Board of examiners constituted by the Principal. As part of Practical Examination -2 (Project) each student has to prepare a project on a topic duly assigned.

Students promoted to the final semester will have to register their topic of dissertation as per the procedure prescribed by the Principal at the beginning of the semester itself. The Viva-Voce, will cover all subjects of the course of study as well as the dissertation work.

The guidelines relating to teaching practice, project, internal test paper, home assignments, dissertation etc. will be available in the handbook provided to the students.

Marks for the internal assessment of various papers shall be awarded by the respective course teacher as per the following breakup.

## **ELIGIBILITY TO REGISTER FOR EXAMINATION AND CONDITION FOR PROMOTION**

Only students who secure the minimum attendance of 75% and above in a semester will be allowed to appear for the examination of that semester. A student who has satisfactorily completed the course of one semester and has registered for the examination of the semester shall be promoted to the next semester.

## PASS MINIMUM AND CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

Those candidates who secure not less-than 50 percent of the aggregate marks of the papers of each semester and not less than 40 percent marks in each individual paper and also a separate minimum of 50 percent in each practical paper, dissertation and viva-voce shall be declared to have passed the L.L.M examination.

Those candidates who secure not less than 60 percent of the marks for the written examinations of all semesters, Practical papers, Dissertation and Viva Voce in the aggregate shall be placed in the first division. The other successful candidate - shall be placed in second division.

## GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

LIBRARY: The students can avail of library facilities from 9.00a.m. to 5.00 p.m., Monday to Saturday. The library is closed on Sundays and all public holidays. Each student is provided with a library card at the beginning of the academic term.

DRESS CODE FOR BOYS: On working days, boys should wear plain white half sleeve formal shirt with formal black pants, black belt and formal black shoe and black socks. On ceremonial occasions boys should wear white formal full sleeve shirt with formal black pants, black blazer, black tie, formal black shoe with black socks.

DRESS CODE FOR GIRLS: On working days, girls should wear plain white formal shirt with three fourth sleeve and formal black pants and sleeveless waist coat (12cm from waistline) with executive black shoes only. Hair should be neatly combed and tied up. On ceremonial occasions girls should wear plain white formal full sleeve

shirt with black pants, formal black blazer and executive black shoes.

Disciplinary action will be taken against students who are not in full uniform along with the exhibited ID card.

PROHIBITION OF MOBILES: As per Government order students are prohibited to use mobile in the campus.

PROHIBITION ON SUBSTANCE USE: Use of tobacco products, drugs, alcohols etc. are stictly banned in the campus.

CAMPUS POLITICS: Students are strictly prohibited from Campus politics.

PARKING OF VEHICLES: Students are not allowed to enter their vehicles into the campus beyond the parking area and beyond the time as per the student code of conduct.

CODE OF CONDUCT: The Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in R.P.No.4351 2003 (Sojan Francis V., M.G. No. 43512003.
